2013 Soccer Hall of Fame Inductees

CHRIS DOYLE

After a storied high school and college soccer career, Doyle became what is believed to be the first Frederick County male native drafted into a U.S. professional soccer league. Doyle starred at Brunswick, where he was a three-time all-state player and two-time Frederick News-Post Player of the Year. He's Brunswick's all-time leading scorer with 113 point (38 goals, 27 assists). He led Brunswick to a state title in 1990, and the program went 39-13-2 during his four years as a varsity starter. He was a four-year starter at Loyola College, and made the all-conference team each year and was named Player of the Year in 1995. He was drafted by the A-League Rochester Rhinos.

BRADLEY GRIMES

Grimes started for Walkersville as a freshman in 1972 and proceeded to play every match for the Lions during his four-year varsity career. He scored the winning goal for Walkersville in a 2-1 state title win over Pocomoke in 1972. He helped Walkersville to a state runner-up finish in 1975. He was a three-time All-County and All-MVAL first-team selection. He was named to the All-Region XX first team during his one season with Frederick Community College. He played for Walkersville in the Mason-Dixon Soccer League from 1975 until 1998, scoring 203 goals with 161 assists. He led Walkersville's Mason-Dixon team to four league championships and three playoff titles. He started playing indoor soccer in the 1980s and remains active today with Bushwallers. He also has coached boys soccer at Walkersville for 14 years.

<mark>John H</mark>orine

Horine had a storied career as both a player and groundbreaking coach. He started four years of varsity soccer at Middletown and four years at Frostburg State, where he led the team in scoring three times. Horine was named All-South in 1956, 1957 and 1958. He was an alternate to the U.S. Northeast Regional team for the 1959 Pan American Games. He also lettered in track, basketball, golf and baseball at Frostburg State and was inducted into the Bobcat Hall of Fame in 1981. Horine coached high school soccer from 1960 until 1966, first at Emmitsburg and then at Middletown. His teams won two county championships. In 1983, he started the first girls high school soccer team in Frederick County, and Middletown went 40-8-1 in his four years as coach.

ROY SIGLER

Sigler began a youth soccer program in 1962 in Middletown while training for the U.S. Pan American Team tryouts. The program continued during the summers from 1963 through 1967, and is regarded as the launching pad for successful youth soccer in Frederick County. Seven members of that original group of 10-12 players went on to play NCAA Division I soccer, and most returned to Frederick County to push soccer forward. Sigler played at Middletown and was a four-year right wing at Frostburg State, where he earned All-South honors all four years and All-America status in 1961. He spent 12 years as a college coach, eight as head coach at Boston University. He was the first inductee into the Frostburg Sports Hall of Fame and was inducted into the Frederick County YMCA Sports Hall of Fame in 1979.
