2017 Soccer Hall of Fame Inductees



KARIN TREESE BAUER



The emergence of the Thomas Johnson girls soccer power in the 1990s started with Karin Treese Bauer as a player, and that presence continues today with the long-time assistant coach, who is now at Urbana. The multi-sport standout at Thomas Johnson went on to a stellar college career at Washington & Lee, where she had 72 goals and 23 assists in 63 career matches. She was a four-time letter winner, two-time team captain, four-time All-ODAC selection and three-time NSCAA All-South selection. Treese Bauer also played basketball and lacrosse at Washington & Lee. She was inducted into the Washington & Lee Hall of Fame, and at the time of her induction still held five women's soccer school records. As an assistant coach at Thomas Johnson and Urbana,

she has been part of 27 championships – 14 conference/county titles, 10 regional titles and three state titles.

Samantha Meyers proved to be a ground-breaking player in Frederick County high school soccer. She was the county's first two-time All-America honoree, the first Parade All-America honoree, the first to garner Gatorade and MACS female state player of the year honors, and she led Thomas Johnson to the first large school state title for any county school – boys or girls. When she graduated from Thomas Johnson in 1998 she held five school records, including goals in a game, season and career. In club soccer, she was a three-time Maryland ODP and Region I ODP participant and spent time as part of the Under-16 National Team player pool. She was a four-year player at the University of Minnesota where she earned second-team All-Big Ten

honors in 2000 and was named team MVP in 2000 and 2001. She was part of two Minnesota teams that reached the NCAA Division I tournament.

ROELKEY MYERS



Roelkey Myers has been involved in local soccer in many facets, including as coach, camp director and official. But it is contribution to the sport as an administrator and organizer to sets him apart. In the 1980s, he created the county's first indoor soccer league at the YMCA. Shortly thereafter, Myers started a 10-player pick-up team to compete in an indoor tournament in Easton, Md., and that effort evolved to "YMCA Select" to "GO Feet" to "Excel," and after merging with a local girls club, became FC Frederick. Myers was a defender for Walkersville High School, which included a state runner-up finish. He also played at Frederick Community College and in the Mason-Dixon League. He was the head coach at Walkersville High for seven seasons

and coached numerous local club teams. He also coached Walkersville Mason-Dixon team to league and tournament titles in 1991. Myers is brainchild behind the Frederick County Soccer Hall of Fame.




HAROLD NEWTON



Although a bulk of Harold Newton's coaching career was in Washington, D.C., his impact in Frederick County has not gone unnoticed. He has been a Middletown Soccer Camp counselor, usually working with the youngest players, the past 35 years. He also has worked the TJ Soccer Camp, Frederick County Soccer Academy, Urbana Soccer Camp and Walkersville Soccer Camp ranging from six to 15 years each. He had short stints in the county as coach at Thomas Johnson High School and cocoach at Frederick Community College. As a head coach, though, his greatest success was at Georgetown Day School, where he collected a record of 307-145-45 in 27 seasons. His Georgetown Day teams won eight Potomac Valley Athletic Conference

championships, five PVAC tournament titles, five Mid-Atlantic Conference titles and one MAC tournament crown. He has a career coaching record of 333-166-46.

BRIAN PARKER



The longtime Frederick resident has built a stellar coaching resume, highlighted by his current tenure at his alma mater Frostburg State, where he coaches the women's soccer team. Parker has a .720 career winning percentage that includes eight conference titles and 12 NCAA/ECAC tournament appearances. The three-time conference coach of the year has coached 85 all-conference players and eight conference players of the year. Even with his commitments to Frostburg, this former Urbana High School girls soccer coach has found a way to stay active locally. He was a founder of Frederick United and served as director from 1992-2002 and recently rejoined the FC Frederick staff. Parker's coaching career started at West Virginia University, where he was an

assistant coach from 1993-1995. He was tasked to launch the Urbana program in 1995 and compiled a 62-36-6 record with two regional titles. He also has coached Maryland and West Virginia ODP teams, and has been a MSYSA and NSCAA coaching instructor.
