2022 Soccer Hall of Fame Inductees



KEITH COLLINS

Keith Collins is an accomplished player, coach, and official. Collins was a three-year varsity defender at Linganore High School. He played for two years at Frederick Community College where after both seasons he was named team MVP and earned MD JuCo and All-Region XX honors. He was a second-team Maryland JuCo selection in 1987 and first-team in 1988. In both years he was a second-team Region XX selection. He's FCC's career assist leader at 24, which included a single-season record

of 18 in 1988. He also scored 11 career goals. He was inducted into the FCC Hall of Fame in 2022. He played one year at Longwood University before turning his attention to coaching. He returned to FCC as a coach, where he spent nine seasons and racked up 68 career victories. He spent 16 years coaching with Frederick Excel and FC Frederick. He began officiating USSF matches in 2012 and started refereeing NCAA and NJCAA matches in 2016. He recently went over 160 career college matches officiated. In addition, he officiated more than 900 matches at Frederick Indoor Soccer Center during a 5 1/2-year career of indoor officiating.

AMY FRANCISCOVICH DAVIS

Amy Franciscovich, as she was known during her playing days, holds the honor of the most distinguished scholar-athlete to hail from Frederick County. While playing a key role as a goalkeeper and piling up records and individual honors during Thomas Johnson's Class 4A state title in 2001, she also collected the titles of Frederick County Scholar-Athlete of the Year, NSCAA National Scholar-Athlete of the Year and 2002 Wendy's High School Heisman winner. She capped her high

school career by being named EST MVP at the Powerade/McDonald's High School All-American Game. At Emory University, she set goalkeeping career records for wins, shutouts, and minutes played. She earned All-University Athletic Association honors three times, including first team in 2005. She received an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship and continued her academic career, ultimately graduating from Harvard Medical School. She is now known as Dr. Amy Davis, serving both Johns Hopkins School of Medicine and Ascension St. Agnes Hospital in Baltimore.



MATT HOLLIS

Labeled as the "smallest varsity player but with big impact," Matt Hollis played a key role in Middletown High School's early 1990s dominance of the local soccer scene. A three-time all-county and all-league pick and two-time all-state selection, he was an impact player for a Middletown varsity squad that posted a 43-2-3 run during his four years. He finished his career with 34 goals and 26 assists while playing alongside fellow Frederick County Soccer Hall of Famers

Matt DeOrsey and Peter Medd. He remains the sixth-leading scorer in Middletown history, fifth in assists, and is one of only two players to record multiple double-digit goal and assist seasons. He was among the first county players to leave the area for higher-level club soccer, playing for Seneca, Potomac United, and Columbia Crew (which placed second in the 1992 State Cup). He had a successful career in the men's league, claiming three Mason-Dixon Cup and three Slick Cup titles with Bushwallers. Since 2008, he has been coaching youth soccer, first with FC Frederick's youth academy, then with Boonsboro Football Club, and currently with Middletown High School.






CHUCK HOMMEY

Chuck Hommey is the man behind the scenes for FC Frederick, holding the title of Director of Operations. He has a USSF B License and a USSF National Youth License that he has put to good use while serving the local soccer community for nearly 30 years. An all-county performer as a goalkeeper at Walkersville High School, Hommey continues to work with top goalkeepers in the area. In addition, he has coached more than 20 teams between club, high school, and summer

pro teams. He has worked with hundreds of players and helped more than 100 players with their college recruiting plans en route to helping them find their way onto college rosters. As a player, Hommey was a walk-on goalkeeper at West Virginia University for two years. He returned to the area and played 15 years in the Maryland Major and Mason-Dixon men's leagues, winning a combined 14 league and championship titles. He has been an FC Frederick Board of Trustee member since 2007 and in his current role with the club, he helps organize and run all sorts of events, ranging from on-field to fundraising.





KATHLEEN VISTICA MCFARLAND

One of the most lethal finishers in Frederick County high school history, McFarland weathered an injury-plagued college career to deliver an amazing senior season. At NCAA Division I Miami University (Ohio), McFarland led the Mid-American Conference in scoring in 2006 with nine goals and six assists. She earned first-team all-MAC honors and was named the Mid-American Conference Player of the Year. She also collected CoSIDA/ESPN the Magazine All-District IV First

Team and Academic All-America First Team honors. Before arriving at Miami, McFarland torched the local soccer scene, scoring an area-record 85 career goals as a four-year varsity player at Urbana High School. Along the way, she set Urbana school records for goals in a season (33) and assists in a season (22). She was an all-state selection in 2001 and 2002. She was honored as the Frederick News-Post Offensive Player of the Year in 2000, 2001 and 2002 and picked up Washington Post All-Metro second-team honors in 2001 and first-team honors in 2002. She played club soccer for Frederick United, where she helped her team to a State Cup title and a USYSA Region I runner-up finish in 2002.


