2025 Soccer Hall of Fame Inductees



ZANE CAMPBELL

Zane Campbell's contributions to soccer span a successful playing career, coaching experience, and leadership in club administration.

Campbell built his foundation early with Frederick Excel (1995–2000), where he earned recognition through Maryland Western District ODP (1997–1998), Maryland State ODP (1998–1999), and the Region I ODP Regional Pool in 1999. He continued his development with Bethesda SC Arsenal from 2000–2003, helping lead the program to an NCSL Division I Championship in 2001 and a Maryland State Cup finalist finish.

His impact was just as strong at Frederick High School, where he graduated in 2003 after earning All-CMC First Team honors and a Maryland All-State selection in 2002. That same season, he helped guide Frederick to a Regional Semifinal appearance.

At Guilford College in Greensboro, N.C., Campbell became one of the most reliable goalkeepers in program history. A four-year starter and team captain, he earned Honorable Mention All-Conference recognition in 2006 while setting lasting records. He ranks first in school history in matches played as goalkeeper (62), second in shutouts (9), third in saves (262), and third in goals-against average (1.62). He was also named to the All-Tournament Team at the Maryville Nike Kick-Off Classic.

Following his collegiate career, Campbell earned an invitation to the MLS/USL professional combine in Tampa, Fla. He later served as an assistant coach at Guilford College from 2007–2013.

Most recently, Campbell has worked as a club administrator for Bethesda SC, helping oversee the day-to-day operations of a program featuring 70 teams and approximately 1,400 players.

PAT DARLING

Pat Darling was one of the most dangerous goal scorers in Frederick County soccer history. A true striker, he built his reputation as a pure finisher, consistently delivering in the biggest moments.

Darling starred at Brunswick High School during the 1990 and 1991 seasons and played a major role in one of the program's most historic achievements. In 1990, he scored two goals in Brunswick's first-ever State Championship victory. He went on to set multiple school records, including a career scoring mark of 42 goals over two years (1990–1991), a single-season record of 22 goals in 1991, and a single-game record with five goals in one match.

Darling earned MVAL First Team honors in both 1990 and 1991 and led all league scorers with 15 goals in conference play. He also led Frederick County in scoring both seasons, totaling 20 goals in 1990 and 22 goals in 1991. His excellence earned Frederick News-Post All-Area First Team recognition in both years, along with Second Team All-State honors in 1991 and selection to the All-State Game. In the 1992 Frederick County–Washington County All-Star Game, Darling scored two goals and was named Match MVP.

At Frederick Community College from 1991–1993, Darling continued his scoring success, leading the conference in goals and earning All-Conference honors in both 1991 and 1992. In 1992, he helped guide FCC to a Region Championship as the team's leading scorer.

SEAN CUNNINGHAM

Sean Cunningham is one of Urbana High School's most accomplished and influential soccer players, combining elite production, leadership, and toughness throughout his career. A midfielder and three-year varsity starter, Cunningham emerged as the centerpiece of Urbana's program and finished his high school career as the school's all-time leader in goals (25), assists (22), and points (72). As a senior, he set a school record with 16 goals in a single season.

Cunningham played a key role in Urbana's rise as a regional power, helping lead the Hawks to the 2000 2A Regional Championship, the 2001 Frederick County Championship and Regional Final, and another Regional Final appearance in 2002.

His individual excellence earned him All-State honors in 2002, along with All-CMC First Team recognition in both 2001 and 2002 after receiving All-CMC Honorable Mention as a sophomore in 2000. He was also selected as a team captain.

Cunningham continued his career at Towson University, competing at the NCAA Division I level in the CAA Conference. A four-year member of the program, he appeared in 62 games, starting as a defender before transitioning into the midfield. He totaled four goals and six assists, including a memorable game-winning assist against Fairfield in the NCAA Tournament that helped propel Towson to the Sweet 16, the furthest postseason run in program history.


Despite knee and back injuries, Cunningham contributed to Towson's historic success, including the 2006 team that finished ranked No. 15 nationally and captured the CAA regular season championship with an unbeaten 10-0-1 league record. He also earned CAA Academic Honors.

DENISE ROGERS-WAHL

Denise Rogers helped shape the Urbana High School girls soccer program from its very beginning. A member of Urbana's first graduating class in 1999, Rogers was a four-year starter and team captain at center back, providing leadership and stability as the young program found its identity. As a ninth grader, she helped lead a team that played primarily a JV schedule and still earned two varsity victories.

Rogers quickly became one of the top defenders in the state while also contributing offensively. As a sophomore in 1996, she scored five goals and earned 1A/2A First Team All-State honors from Washington Soccer Net, along with First Team All-Area recognition from both the Frederick News-Post and Hagerstown Morning Herald. That season, she helped lead Urbana to the 1A/2A West Region title. In 1997 and 1998, she continued to excel, earning multiple All-State selections, Mid-Maryland Defensive Player of the Year honors, and repeated First Team All-Conference and All-Area recognition.

Beyond high school, Rogers was a standout with Frederick United Soccer Club and earned Maryland ODP State and Region I Pool selection honors. She went on to play collegiately on scholarship at the University of Mississippi (SEC) before transferring to Elon University, where she became a two-year starter and team captain and helped lead the program to the 2001 Big South regular-season title.

Rogers later played semi-professionally for the Maryland Pride in 2004 and began a coaching career that included serving as an assistant coach at Frostburg State in 2003, winning a conference title and reaching the NCAA Tournament. She later returned home as an Urbana assistant coach for five seasons, helping the program capture its first Maryland State Championship in 2007 while also serving as a teacher and assistant athletic director.

JOSH GILMORE

Josh Gilmore has dedicated more than 30 years to Frederick County soccer as a player, coach, and administrator, leaving a lasting impact at the high school, collegiate, club, and state levels. His commitment to developing both athletes and the programs that support them has made him one of the most respected leaders in the local soccer community.

Gilmore currently serves FC Frederick Soccer Club in multiple leadership roles, including FC Frederick Juniors Director, Travel Futsal Director, Winter Soccer School Director, Pro Director of Operations, and Coaching Education Coordinator.

In these positions, he oversees player development, staff support, programming, scheduling, league relations, and coach education initiatives, helping strengthen the club from the grassroots level through its highest competitive teams.

As a coach, Gilmore holds US Soccer Federation “C” and “D” Licenses and has spent more than 15 years with FC Frederick. He coached nine years with the Maryland Olympic Development Program, leading U13 and U14 boys. He also guided FC Frederick’s CCL Pro23 men’s program as head coach and assistant coach, while serving nine seasons as an assistant coach for Hood College men’s soccer.

At the high school level, Gilmore led Linganore High School as varsity head coach for nine seasons and JV head coach for three seasons. Under his leadership, Linganore won the 2011 MVAL Championship and captured the 2012 3A West Region Championship, advancing to the state semifinals.

Gilmore also founded Frederick Community College’s women’s soccer program, serving as its first head coach and building the team from the ground up. He later coached Loyola College’s women’s club team as well.

As a player, Gilmore competed for Linganore High School, Frederick Community College, and Bushwallers FC, earning All-CMC and All-Area honors in 1994.
